Do you have a runny toilet?

Here's a simple test to see if your toilet tank is leaking. Conduct this test once a year.

- 1) Remove the toilet tank lid and place flat on floor (1).
- 2) Add 1 dye tablet or 1 teaspoon of food coloring to tank (2).
- 3) Wait for 1-2 hours for the dye to mix and any water to leak. (Do not use the toilet until test is over.)
- 4) Check the toilet bowl for colored water. Clear water indicates no leak (3), but colored water in the bowl (4) indicates a water leaking via the flapper.
- 5) If the toilet fails this test, you have a runny toilet and need a new flapper (5).
